The Information Centre has had a long history in the community. It is recognized as the first location in White River to house the first Winnie-the-Pooh collection, an event which pre-dates the existence of the Museum! Long hours were placed in fixing the building and the information centre has been up and running since late June.

The new team of greeters has already welcomed over hundreds of visitors to the community and has been working on weekly events. They began their series of activities with the July 1st, Canada Day Celebration, in collaboration with the Heritage Museum. Their momentum did not stop as they continued with events such as Winnie-the-Pooh Wipe Out Course and scavenger hunt. As more events are being planned for the month of August, be sure to keep an eye out as you will certainly be laughing and having a blast until the end of summer.
